BEFORE YOU START

- You will need to be employed and registered with the Department of Enterprise before you
 can be accepted onto the apprenticeship training programme.
- The apprenticeship training programme typically takes around 4 years to complete.

Level 3 Electrotechnical Qualification (Installation) (5357-03) e-portfolio from City & Guilds. You'll be assessed on both your knowledge and performance.

The 7 e-portfolio units are 102, 106, 108, 109, 113, 115 and 018 (18th Edition)





AM2S - ASSESSMENT OF COMPETENCE²

To achieve your qualification you'll need to take the industry assessment of competence, the AM2S, which tests everything you've learnt during your training.





QUALIFIED ELECTRICIAN³

Once you've passed your AM2S your training is complete.

This will assist you in progressing onto the Construction Isle of Man Certification Scheme register.
