#### **BEFORE YOU START**

- You will need to be employed and registered with the Department of Enterprise before you can be accepted onto the apprenticeship training programme.
- The apprenticeship training programme typically takes around 4 years to complete.

#### **NVQ - NATIONAL VOCATIONAL QUALIFICATION<sup>1</sup>**

Level 3 Electrotechnical Qualification (Installation) (5357-94) logbook from City & Guilds. You'll continue to be assessed on your remaining knowledge units and begin the logbook units (NVQ).

The 6 logbook units are 102, 106, 118, 109, 113 and 115.





### AM2S - ASSESSMENT OF COMPETENCE<sup>2</sup>

To achieve your qualification you'll need to take the industry assessment of competence, the AM2S, which tests everything you've learnt during your training.





## QUALIFIED ELECTRICIAN<sup>3</sup>

Once you've passed your AM2S, your training is complete.

This will assist you in progressing onto the Construction Isle of Man Certification Scheme register.

- At present we teach C&G 2365 Level 2 and C&G 5357 Level 3 as our technical certificates.
- 1 We commence the performance units of the 5357 NVQ logbook (including successful completion of the 18th Edition 2382-22) at this stage.
- 2 The AM2S is the industry End Point Assessment.
- 3 Successful completion will allow the apprentice to apply for an ECS Gold Card.
